





I could hardly contain my excitement and optimism when our partner Dr. William Novick from the International Children's Heart Foundation (ICHF) arrived in Nasiriyah in late July to begin our year-long Remedy Fellowship.

For the first time in the history of modern Iraq, a bona fide expert would be on-hand to provide lifesaving heart surgeries and hands-on training for 40+ weeks out of the year. Iraqi nurses would have Western counterparts at their sides nearly every day of the year—to set an example for them, walk them through the foundational aspects of patient care, and catch their fall along the way.

By the end of 2012, more than 90 children had received surgeries through Remedy Fellowship. Success rates on all of the simple and moderate cases remained well within the acceptable standards of any hospital, let alone a developing environment like ours. In addition to providing the lifesaving surgeries, the Fellowship had established a robust model for surgical training and development that is unlike anything else in the entire country.

None of these unprecedented accomplishments would have been possible without donors and supporters like you, our field partners at ICHF, Living Light International, and For Hearts And Souls, and the government officials who have consistently requested and facilitated our efforts across the country.

As we move into 2013, we still see many opportunities for improvement and growth, and we are grateful for your ongoing commitment to our vision to pursue peace and remake the world through the healing that comes from lifesaving heart surgery.








Each mission provides 15-20 lifesaving heart operations and hundreds of hours of practical, hands-on instruction, helping remake the world one heart at a time.














Remedy Missions in 5 provinces serve families from every ethnicity, faith background, and economic class in Iraq.



CONGENITAL HEART DEFECTS unmade Dr. Akeel's world. His brother, nephew, and best friend's son died because they didn't have access to lifesaving heart surgeries. Instead of resigning himself to anger or defeat, Dr. Akeel dreamt of a day when Iraq's healthcare system could repair the hearts of its own children, and he dreamt of being a part of it. Now a pediatric heart surgeon in Nasiriyah, he shares our vision of remaking the world through healing. Last year, he proposed a bold, new approach to turn that vision into reality.

On August 1, 2012, we celebrated the launch of Dr. Akeel's most recent dream: Remedy Fellowship, an unprecedented investment into the Iraqi healthcare system and the lives of hundreds of children. Remedy Fellowship consists of year-round, hands-on training for heart surgeons, nurses, anesthesiologists, and technicians at the Nasiriyah Heart Center. Our partners at ICHF have implemented a weekly regimen of lectures, practicals, case conferences, and operations lasting from August 2012 until summer 2013.



Remedy Fellowship puts the long-term solution to The Backlog of heart defects back in the hands of Iraqis, making daily progress towards healing hearts now and for years to come. The hope that accompanies this progress lives in the remade hearts of the children of Nasiriyah, in the commitment of medical volunteers to this unprecedented training program, and in the vision of local pediatric heart surgeons like Dr. Akeel. Halfway through the yearlong initiative, we continue to strive for more than a dream—we strive for the sustainable development of Iraq's healthcare system.




IS A CHILD BORN IN IRAQ MORE LIKELY TO HAVE A CONGENITAL HEART DEFECT THAN A CHILD BORN IN AMERICA?

WHY MIGHT THE RISK BE GREATER?

HOW CAN WE BEST DIAGNOSE THESE CHILDREN?

With these questions in mind and new ECHO diagnostic technology in hand, Dr. Kirk Milhoan of For Hearts And Souls and Dohuk cardiologist Dr. Serdar Pedawi screened 176 newborns in one week.







40 training hours provided

Our first research Mission found 13.6% of newborns in Dohuk to be born with congenital heart defects. Interviews with parents provided data to better understand which issues or exposures may contribute to risk for CHD. Following the Mission, PLC intern Alicia Lay and Dr. Kirk shared the findings with the 6th World Congress for Pediatric and Cardiac Surgery in Capetown, South Africa.

We are thankful for local physicians like Dr. Serdar, who continues to monitor children with known heart defects born in Dohuk. Together, we are taking steps forward so that we can save as many children as possible—no matter where they're born.





HEARTMENDER TOUR

IMAGINE A CITY where war destroyed 70% of the homes, parks, community centers, and roads. Imagine a city where, following that war, birth defects began to plague 1 in 7 newborns.


That city is Fallujah.

Labeled a "bomb-making factory" and declared an Al-Qaeda stronghold, the Iraq War's fiercest battles took place in Fallujah, which led Colonel Joseph Dunford to predict that in the future "Americans will never be welcomed."

Stories like this remind us that remaking the world includes mending hearts in more settings than the operating room. Healing comes also through peaceful reconciliation across continents, religions, and backgrounds.



In July 2012, we imagined a new relationship between Americans and Fallujans and brought in one of the very first medical teams to Fallujah since the war. This new beginning only took place because you joined us and listened to the story of Fallujah—more than merely listened, you gave, supported, and imagined a new story. Each year we set out on The Heartmender Tour, taking to the road and to the air to spread the message of preemptive love to friends.



In 2012, we engaged hearts and minds at college campuses, churches, mosques, tea shops, and living rooms from Malibu to Baghdad. Whether we met at the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, D.C., or at TEDxAustin—we're grateful for all those who joined us to be a part of breaking down stereotypes and mending hearts. Thanks to your part in the Heartmender Tour, we do more than imagine new beginnings, new hearts, and new relationships—we create them.

Dr. William Novick and his international surgical teams began saving lives and training medical professionals in developing countries in 1994, and now we've teamed up to create a medical infrastructure throughout Iraq capable of operating on every Iraqi child in need of heart surgery.

We have worked with Dr. Kirk Milhoan and For Hearts & Souls (FHAS) since early in our time in Iraq, first as a cardiologist consultant and now on Missions to the cities of Fallujah and Dohuk. Dr. Kirk is among the world's most traveled and experienced echocardiographers, having diagnosed, triaged, and treated children from Mongolia, Nepal, Kosovo, Papua-New Guinea, and Iraq.



LIVING LIGHT INTERNATIONAL

Living Light International (LLI) is our cultural compass in Iraq. Without their guidance and know-how, navigating the red tape and negotiating lifesaving collaboration here would be impossible. LLI's Founder and President Nadwa Qaragholi puts her incredible connections and networking skills to use each day on behalf of Iraqi children, negotiating new frontiers and new programs for the expansion and improvement of pediatric cardiac care across Iraq.

MENDING KIDS INTERNATIONAL

We share a common passion with Mending Kids International (MKI)—providing lifesaving and life-changing surgeries to children. MKI partners with hospitals, organizations, and donors in 41 countries around the world and supports cardiac surgery in Iraq through generous donations towards individual children's operations.

ONE DAY'S WAGES

In October, One Day's Wages helped remake the world through a donation campaign and match to raise a total of \$10,000 for Remedy Mission supplies. One Day's Wages brings together individuals and organizations that share a passion for alleviating extreme poverty.
